REFLECTION

ADVENT SUNDAY

"...give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light..."

They're on their way...the Wise Men that is! They did come from "afar" after all...and though we do not know quite where that was, it was...afar!

Advent reminds us that we too need to make a journey to the manger: one that of necessity will need to cross the rough terrain and inhospitable deserts that lie between us and our Lord. As the rigour of Lent seeks to prepare pilgrims for the glories of Easter, so the coming weeks of Advent remind us that - if we are to meet our Incarnate Lord in his manger - we too will need to move on from where we are.

Our Advent candles (progressively lit on the Sundays of the coming month) remind us of the landmarks along the way of our Biblical predecessors. They remind us of **patriarchs** and **prophets** who led the way...in order that people like **John the Baptist** - and even **Mary** herself – might follow. They all trod difficult paths on their faithful journeyings...and encountered many hurdles; but lest we think that such is 'job done' for us too, Advent reminds us that (if we needed any prompting) we too need to step out in faith.

The Christian message flourishes in the hearts of those who allow time and space for the Lord to speak to them. In each generation, there is always much to crowd out such encounters; but I am reminded of the prophet Elijah who only heard the Lord on the Holy Mountain in the moments of respite from the elements...in the relative silence. Such oases of calm might seem elusive at this time of year, but the Advent Candles remind us of the necessity to seek them out nevertheless.
