REFLECTION

Genesis 1.1 - 2.3 Romans 8.18-25 Matthew 6.25-34

It's the year of Matthew's Gospel, and this week's reading is from one of the highlights of that gospel – **The Sermon on the Mount** – chapters 5,6 and 7 of Matthew. The technical term for this sort of writing is Wisdom literature, (another example would be the Old Testament Book of Proverbs); the purpose is to give practical advice for daily living.

At first sight today's practical teaching might seem rather reckless.

Jesus tells his listeners: *"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?"* His aim, of course is not that we all starve or walk around in rags; it is to encourage us to re-assess our needs and ambitions. He is challenging us to think beyond our material concerns and preoccupations: *"it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and, indeed, your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."*

Jesus does not want us to stop earning a living, or to renounce all the essentials of life. God's people are, however called to have different priorities from the rest of the world, (represented by *the Gentiles* in this passage). Re-thinking our priorities will mean different things to different people. It is too simplistic to say that the last part of a person to be converted is his wallet; (in my case, I am more attached to my car keys!). We are called to bring our whole lives and lifestyles under God's sovereignty, and to offer all that we are, not just all that we have to him, and to seek, with our whole selves, His Kingdom and His guidance for our place in that Kingdom.
