REFLECTION

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Today is the start of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This is an ecumenical celebration that gives us an opportunity to focus our prayers on Christian unity with our siblings in Christ across the globe. We will join in this celebration at EBC this morning in our United Service with Churches Together in Swanage.

The central text that has been chosen for this year is Ephesians 4: 1-13 which includes the words "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling." This verse summarises Paul's teachings about unity and emphasises that the followers of Christ are to represent "one body and one Spirit" united in a single hope. This metaphor shows the Church as a unified entity transcending barriers of geography, nationality, ethnicity, and tradition.

This seems particularly apt in light of the incredibly divisive and inflammatory actions taken across the pond in the first two weeks of this year... Never have we needed unity more, a unity that is shaped by the love of Christ which can bring into the world be deep love and care for our neighbours.

Paul adds "one Spirit" in the passage above to emphasize that it is the Holy Spirit who sustains this fellowship and empowers the Church to fulfil its mission. To stand united against the evils of this age, against though who would sow division and hatred amongst us, requires strength, a strength that comes from God in his Spirit.

Let us pray as we go through this week that we will be reading to respond to God's call to seek reconciliation and spread unity and peace in the world.
