REFLECTION

Although the Feast of the Transfiguration is observed in August, some new lectionaries include it as a prelude to Lent. The idea is that the ultimate confirmation of Jesus's identity to Peter, James and John prepares them (and us) for Jesus's inexorable journey to Jerusalem. Jesus transfigured is at one with, but radically different from Elijah (the prophets) and Moses (the Law): here is 'the Son of God', familiar from first Temple theology, united with the Father and the *shekinah* or indwelling (*sh-k-r*) feminine Spirit in the Temple, represented in scripture as cloud, dove, light, water, fire, Wisdom.

Peter wants to build *Succoth* ('booths') for Moses, Elijah and Jesus because it is around the time of Succoth, the feast of Tabernacles, when Hebrews would seek God by dwelling in tents for a week *q.v.* Leviticus 23), but the Voice in the Cloud shuts that pious suggestion down mid-sentence - Jesus is *my Son*: listen to *Him*. It is the same Voice and Cloud heard at Jesus's baptism. Matthew's Transfiguration – "after six days" – ie on the Sabbath) is also a post-resurrection experience, resonating with the experience of the Marys at the tomb on the Sabbath of Sabbaths, and the disciples' sight and worship of Jesus in Galilee (Matt 28:1-10). It also resonates with Matthew's mystery of the hidden treasure, hidden and revealed, sought and found.

Serious continuities and discontinuities for us, then: the first universal covenant and the blood covenant; the Law and the indwelling Spirit; physical and spiritual vision; Jesus and God-in-Trinity. There is also the contradiction in both Old and New Testaments that we can indeed 'see God' – full 'salvation' described in the scriptures - but that it is impossible to see God – because unredeemed humanity is too sinful, and/or because our physical eyes can't (by definition) see what is spiritual.

First temple theology (expressed in Exodus 24, rather than Exodus 33.20 or Deuteronomy 4:12) expresses the gracious indwelling and self-revelation of God *within* Creation: the architecture, rites and teaching represent Genesis 1. God dwells within it, veiled but visible to his 'Sons' – his anointed ones. Jesus the promised *nazar* (restorer) comes to redeem all people and heal their blindness and deafness (Isaiah 6:9). He fulfils the Law, so they are free of it, and may live eternally, restored to Eden (Rev. 2:7).

Use the eyes and ears you have to seek the treasure, see, hear and live?
