Reading for this Sunday: Romans 15, 4 - 13

Gospel Reading: Matthew 3, 1 - 12

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said.

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord,

make his paths straight."

Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit worthy of repentance. Do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

'I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

REFLECTION

Today we will light the second candle on our Advent wreaths. This candle has been taken to symbolize the prophets. The lives of the Old Testament prophets were shaped by waiting-waiting for the coming of the Messiah which had been foretold to them by God. In this month of Advent we mirror the prophets' lives of expectation, dwelling on passages of scripture in which the coming of Christ is prophesied. These prophecies make up a rich tapestry of Christ's identity which are included in the liturgy of this season in the Advent O Antiphons. These ancient refrains have been used in our advent prayers since the 6th or 7th century and are useful for reflection as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ.

Each of the antiphons are titles drawn from the Old Testament prophets. In Latin they are: Sapientia, Adonai, Radix Jesse, Clavis David, Oriens, Rex Gentium, Emmanuel, and in English: Wisdom, Lord, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Morning Star, King of the Nations, God with us. When read in reverse in the first letters of each title forms an acrostic- ERO CRAS which is Latin for "I will be with you tomorrow" reinforcing the immediacy of Christ's coming (and knowing the speed with which Advent usually goes, it will not be long before we will indeed celebrate Christ's coming into the world!).

There is an additional antiphon however that is included in the Sarum Rite (the medieval liturgy used at Salisbury Cathedral) and so is unique to our Cathedral and which I think we can lay claim to in the rest of Salisbury Diocese as well! And that is O Virgin of Virgins. Because Mary, the mother of Jesus, expresses the perfect faith- a faith that is humble, expectant and that rejoices in God's promises which will be fulfilled at Christmas with the birth of Jesus.

Let us pray then that as we journey through Advent and prepare ourselves to celebrate the coming of Christ into the world to be like Mary, listening to God's call on her life with humility, in sure and joyful expectation that Christ, our Emmanuel, is coming. *Veni Emmanuel, Come Lord Jesus!* Amen.
